The survey question was placed online between 9.56PM (BST) 14th August 2020 - 9.56PM (BST) 16th August 2020. The poll was run with the hashtags: #Covid #Covidiot as these were the two most popular Covid-19 related hashtags in the UK at the time.

It would appear that a staggering 56% of respondents would not download the UK Government's app. This also validates a recent [Guardian](#) article which indicated that only 50% of the population would download the app. Although this poll has that figure at 23.5%, it also revealed that a quarter of respondents were undecided.
